## MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES

Membership dues include journal subscription. Members receive 24 <u>ELECTRONIC</u> issues of the *Journal of Biomedical Materials Research* (including eight <u>ELECTRONIC</u> issues of *Applied Biomaterials*) and four issues of the *Biomaterials Forum*. Members receive discounts on all other Society publications and can subscribe to any of the optional journals at reduced rates. Members can also attend annual meetings, special symposia, workshops, and short courses at reduced registration fees. Members can also participate in Special Interest Groups, sharing in topical networking and educational programming opportunities.

## Active Membership

Any person (including Post Grads) not currently a full-time student, who has an interest in the field of biomaterials shall be eligible to be an Active member.

#### Student/Post-Grad Associate Membership:

Any full-time student or recent graduate, if not currently employed or pursuing additional training in the field of biomaterials, is eligible for an Associate Membership. An Associate member shall have no voting rights and shall not hold office in the Society but may be appointed to serve on committees.
